The Old-Time Herald has been publishing four times a year since 1987 when it was founded in Galax, Virginia - articles, reviews, festival schedules, and much, much more. Since 2006, we have been bringing you the same great content in six issues a year.

Subscription prices are \$28 for one year and \$50 for two years. Canadian rates are \$35 for one year and \$64 for two years (USD). Other foreign subscriptions are \$38 for one year and \$70 for two years (USD).
